
2017 VERAMONTE CARMÉNÈRE PRIMUS

Really dark in the glass, virtually opaque, with lovely red fruit, green bell pepper, white pepper, and a touch of earth on the nose. Big and fruity on the palate, with considerable heft particularly for a Chilean wine. Paired well with my huge Ribeye, which was still lighter than the bottle.
